

# Construction Notice

## Sewer Main Repair

In the coming weeks, the Town will be conducting sewer line repairs in CLV. Unfortunately, this type of activity brings construction traffic, travel delays/detours, flaggers, lawn disturbance, and (sometimes) service interruptions.

As we will attempt to make the project as painless as possible, we ask for your cooperation in a couple areas.

1. Watch out for large vehicles and equipment. These may be parked or moving in and out of the right of way.
2. Please take care while travelling through construction zones. Workers must often traverse from the worksite to trucks for needed supplies or tools. Pay attention to, and heed the directions given by flaggers.
3. Be patient while traveling, we try to keep stoppages as short as possible. If you are directed to detour around the site, follow signs, or directions from flaggers.
4. The work being performed will require equipment, supplies, and workers to pass through yards. We try to keep work within designated easements, but this is often impossible. If your lawn is damaged, it will be repaired.

If the work should cause a loss of service to your home, you may contact any of the workers, or call 812-544-3329 for assistance.

**More specifically, the work will be done in the, 3<sup>rd</sup> - (Lots 155 and 156), and 4<sup>th</sup> - (Lots 18,19,20,21 and 22) Subdivisions, as well as, near the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> tee on the golf course.**

We will be repairing the mains by "Slip Lining" the existing pipe. The process will line the interior of the host pipe with a synthetic lining impregnated with epoxy. The process will involve the use of high-pressure cleaning which may cause a vacuum condition in the sewer line. This process can pull water from sink, tub, and floor drain traps in your home. It can also cause water disturbance in your commode. If any of these conditions occur, call the utility for assistance. One way of finding out if your traps have been emptied is a "rotten egg" odor in our home. If you notice the odor, simply run water into the traps to re-fill.
